Annual Business Meeting Minutes

October 25, 2012

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 by President Ben Geaumont at the Seven Seas in Mandan.

Secretary/Treasurer Report: Jen Obrigewitch read the 2011 minutes. Toby Stroh moved that the minutes were approved as read. Bob Patten seconded the motion and it passed. The 2012 financial statements for the chapter accounts are as follows.

Environmental Impact Committee: Mike Brand said there was nothing to report as we had not been asked to comment on anything in the past year.

Youth Committee: Kevin Sedivec reported that in this 37th year of youth range camp, they had 17 campers (all-time low), but it was a good quality camp and next year it will be moved further from the FFA convention dates which may have affected attendance this year. They didn't lose money for the first time in a while, mostly due to sponsors.

State Range judging was in September in Gackle with 68 contestants.

Next year the high school Envirothon Contest will focus on Range.

Kevin also took an FFA team to plant ID contest in OKC this year.

Awards: Once again, we didn't nominate anyone for a chapter award. Jon Fettig would like to nominate Rob Brooks this year. Jack Dahl had mentioned two possible producer candidates last year and Corie Lund mentioned Kelly Krabbenhoft as a consultant candidate. We can contact Kim Haile for how to proceed with nominees through the section.

Jeff Printz said he could send an electronic copy of the nomination form to Jon.

Jen said she would check with Jack Dahl and see if he was still interested in nominating a rancher and with Corie to see if she still wanted to nominate Kelly.

Section Report: No Report.

OLD BUSINESS:

Adult Range Camp: The adult range camp committee consists of Jen Obrigewitch, Kevin Sedivec, Jeff Printz, and Cheryl Doll. Jeff will check and see if Josh Dukart will be the liaison with GLCI and if they might want to partner with us. Original plans were to have DSU host the camp in late August (start of school). It could be offered for college credit if students desire. Motel room availability is much less of a concern in Dickinson now, than it was a year ago. Shelly Doyle in Mandan may have info from camps of years past. Jen will check. Jen moved that Jon Fettig check with SCD's at their upcoming convention to see if they would want to sponsor adult range camp. Miranda seconded. Committee will proceed with planning through emails.

NEW BUSINESS:

Suggestion of putting together something to honor Paul and Ann Nyren for their years with SRM and contribution to range was discussed. Toby moved and Jeff seconded to buy a framed plant mount from Janet Patten as a gift. Jeff can get a small engraving to mount on the frame. The Chapter will pay and it can be presented at the Central Grasslands Field Day in June.

Jon and Ben indicated they would like to see members/chapter be more active during the year. Kevin suggested sponsoring more educational workshops and if we had the money, possibly host our own. More educational meetings are desired by the entire group.

Reasons for declining membership were identified as NRCS losing money to send employees and most of the USFS employees have lost interest, not sure why. We would like to try and pull range forum members into SRM. Mike doesn't want to give out email list but will gladly share information with the list if you send info to him.

Ideas for next year's Chapter meeting include having a day or afternoon of speakers, then an evening business meeting, then a half or whole day field tour the next day. Having the meeting in a facility that allows alcohol was favored by several. A possible tour of the ranch of the recipient of Range Manager of the Year award and presentation of the award at the tour would be a possible field option. If we need to we could charge a fee for attending the tour/speakers.

Jen thinks the meeting needs to be planned and advertised much earlier for better attendance.

A Workshop on Indicators of Range Health is in the early planning stages for mid-late August 2013. Jeff and Toby are working on this project geared toward students and ranchers. Aug 11-16 is likely the week. We could possibly have an SRM meeting in conjunction with this project.

Kevin is doing paperwork for nominating Chris Schauer for young professional's award.

It was mentioned that Miles City will have a Section Meeting Dec. 5th with fire as an educational topic.

Technology News - Mike Brand

The landscape has changed in the world of digital cameras used during rangeland management activities. Digital cameras were a major advance in our ability to capture information during projects and inspection work but they did not get rid of the tedious chore of recording the location of each photograph on forms or perhaps on the almost universal pocket note book. Who hasn't decided to take a short cut at the end of the day hoping to remember where the last few pictures were taken only to forget. All pictures of grass look pretty much the same a week after they are taken. Now there is a better alternative. Most camera manufacturers offer ruggedized digital cameras with built in GPS, compass and date/time downloaded automatically from satellites. Ruggedized cameras have dropped in price during the past 12 months and provide high quality images. The digital images also contain the GPS location, the direction you are facing, the time taken and the date taken.

These pocket sized cameras are also water proof, dust proof and can be cropped out of a pickup without damage. All of these features are easy to use and view on Picasa by Google (available as a free download). This merging of GPS, with digital cameras in a rugged case at a reasonable price is great advancement in a range management tool that nearly everyone uses.

Recovery After Wildfire Symposium

December 5th starting at 9 a.m. through noon on December 6th Sleep Inn Hotel, Miles City, MT

Representatives from the Miles City BLM and NRCS offices and U.S. Forest Service will discuss the 2012 fire season, including fire behavior and suppression tactics as well as agency recommendations associated with post-wildfire grazing on federal land. Ranchers affected by the 2012 wildfires will share concerns regarding wildfire impacts from a producer's standpoint. Invited ranchers from eastern Montana will also talk about previous wildfire experience and grazing management implementation following wildfire. The BLM will also discuss their prescribed burning program to reduce wildfire risk and improve rangeland health. Other topics will include current fire science research conducted at Fort Keogh Livestock and Range Research Laboratory, water and soil erosion impacts following fire presented by Montana State University, revegetation options and weed prevention following wildfire by the USDA-NRCS Bridger Plant Materials Center and Forest Management in eastern Montana presented by the DNRC.

Cost to attend is \$10.00 per person which will include a catered lunch from the Rib & Chop House on December 5th.

The Sleep Inn Hotel will have rooms blocked for December 4 & 5, and will hold them until November 19th for \$77.00/night/room.
